

# SERVICES & FACILITIES

## LAW ENFORCEMENT

Goal 8.01 Protection and enhancement of the quality of life by reducing the loss of life and personal property due to crime. (PSG-1)

Policy 8.01.01 Establish a minimum level of service for the provision of law enforcement services. (PSP-1)

Policy 8.01.02 Determine the impact proposed development will have on the provision of law enforcement services, and assure that the established level of service is maintained (PSP-2) by requiring all new development to pay its fair share for the provision of law enforcement services. (PSP-3)

Policy 8.01.03 Continue to support a cooperative approach to law enforcement within the Mendocino National Forest and between the Cities and State law enforcement agencies. (PSP-6)

Policy 8.01.04 Actively involve law enforcement personnel in land use planning decisions (PSP-4) by requiring new development to be designed so that criminal activity is discouraged. (PSP-8)

~~Support consolidation of services for the areas located within the urban limit lines of the cities of Willows and Orland.~~ (PSP-5)

~~Objectively evaluate proposals for regional and State correctional facilities within the county.~~ (PSP-7)

## FIRE PROTECTION

Goal 8.02 Protection and enhancement of the quality of life by reducing the loss of life and personal property due to fire. (PSG-2)

# SERVICES & FACILITIES

- Policy 8.02.01** Recognize the autonomy of individual fire districts within the county (PSP-27) and continue to support the County's volunteer fire forces and offer incentives for continued participation (PSP-9) to maintain existing fire service levels and not allow their deterioration. (PSP-10)
- Policy 8.02.02** Determine the impact proposed development will have on the provision of fire protection services, and ensure that the established level of service is maintained (PSP-11) by actively involving fire protection personnel in land use planning decisions. (PSP-15)
- Policy 8.02.03** Regularly review and evaluate fire district boundaries to determine if the existing service areas are the most efficient and cost-effective (PSP-12) and establish as a priority adequate funding and fire fighting personnel for those areas targeted for growth. (PSP-13)
- Policy 8.02.04** Require new development to be designed with fire protection and prevention in mind (PSP-16) by applying contemporary fire prevention standards to all development. (PSP-17) and considering fire risk and hazard zones when approving residential development in areas subject to potential wildland fires (PSP-20) with all development within the State Responsibility Area complying with the State of California Fire Safety Regulations ~~for located within Glenn County.~~ (PSP-22)
- Policy 8.02.05** Encourage fire districts to work with the County to require new development to pay its fair share for the provision of new fire stations, equipment, personnel and fire suppression improvements necessary to provide adequate fire protection services. (PSP-14)
- Policy 8.02.06** Evaluate the creation of urban area fire departments for the Willows and Orland areas ~~which~~ that would serve both the developed areas and developing areas within established ~~urban limit lines~~ community growth boundaries. (PSP-18)
- Policy 8.02.07** Study the use of mutual aid agreements or memoranda of understanding for structural as well as wildland fire protection in

areas currently under California Department of Forestry and U.S. Forest Service jurisdiction. (PSP-19)

**Policy 8.02.08** Require that all community water systems serving new development meet or exceed Glenn County minimum standards for provision of water for peakload demands and required fire flows. (PSP-21)

**Policy 8.02.09** Assign house numbers for all structures within the county and require such numbers be displayed and visible from the public road. (PSP-23)

## EMERGENCY SERVICES

**Goal 8.03** Protection and enhancement of the quality of life by reducing the loss of life and personal property due to emergencies. [To ensure that the City of Orland and involved local agencies are able to effectively respond to emergency situations that may threaten the people and property of Orland. (OSS Goal 3.1)]

**Policy 8.03.01** Periodically update the Emergency Response Plan (PSP-6) and communicate ~~it the Emergency Response Plan~~ to all public safety agencies when reviewing future development proposals throughout the county. (PSP-24)

**Policy 8.03.02** Encourage development of educational programs that will increase public awareness of fire safety and emergency response planning. (PSP-25)

## PARKS

**Goal 8.04** Develop and sustain an integrated and cohesively designed park system that is complimentary to existing and proposed development as well as the natural environment. (OOC Goal 4.8)

# SERVICES & FACILITIES

Policy 8.04.01 Establish mechanisms for funding park acquisition and development, as well as ongoing costs of park maintenance ~~and recreation services~~. (CDP-140)

Policy 8.04.02 Establish minimum standards for park lands to be provided to all residents in coordination with services and facilities provided by other jurisdictions.

## RECREATION SERVICES

Goal 8.05 Establish recreation programs to meet the needs of residents and visitors.

Policy 8.05.01 Establish recreational programs to be provided to all residents in coordination with services provided by other jurisdictions.

Policy 8.05.02 Establish mechanisms for funding recreation program, as well as ongoing costs for recreation services in cooperation with other jurisdictions.

## EDUCATION SERVICES

Goal 8.06 Urge all school districts to develop facility plans that can be used to assure good community growth pattern, safe routes to schools, and adequate and timely placement of facilities.

Policy 8.06.01 Consider supplemental school mitigation fees for those instances where supplemental fees are necessary to meet the facility funding needs of a school district and where other methods of school financing are not adequate. "Supplemental school mitigation fees"

shall mean payments made to a school district by a developer of a residential, commercial or industrial project to mitigate the impact on school facilities caused by the project, in addition to fees imposed pursuant to Government Code Section 65995. (CDP-136)

**Policy 8.06.02** Grant a discretionary land use approval, which is necessary for residential, commercial or industrial development, only if the school district or districts within whose boundaries the development is planned first certifies to the Board of Supervisors that: the subject development will not significantly impact school facilities; the developer has paid in full the supplemental school mitigation fees corresponding to the development, or; that the developer has arranged and agreed to mitigate the impact on school facilities in some other manner satisfactory to the district, consistent with the district's financing plan. ~~As used in this policy, "discretionary land use approval" means a zoning change, general plan amendment, any other legislative action, and certification or approval of a negative declaration (ND) or an environmental impact report (EIR) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).~~ This policy shall apply only if the affected school district has: adopted a facilities plan; adopted a school financing plan describing the sources and amounts of funds required to fully implement the facilities plan; and completed a valid study justifying the amount of the supplemental school mitigation fees. (CDP-137)

**Policy 8.06.03** Work with school districts to adopt a facilities plan and a school financing plan describing the sources and amounts of funds required to fully implement the facilities plan.

**Policy 8.06.04** Ensure that supplemental school mitigation fees as established by the affected school district are in an amount ~~which~~ that does not exceed the amount necessary, when added to other reasonably assured sources of funding identified in the school facilities financing plan, to fully implement the adopted school facilities plan. (CDP-138)

**Policy 8.06.05** Work with all school districts experiencing urban and suburban growth to establish safe routes to schools and establishment of elementary school site within ½ mile of such development to allow students to safety walk to school.

Goal 8.07 Foster better services to residents for post-secondary educational opportunities.

Policy 8.07.01 Work with post-secondary educational institutions to establish and maintain post-secondary educational opportunities for Glenn County residents.

Policy 8.07.02 Work with Butte Community College District to establish a Glenn County campus.

## HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

Goal 8.08 Provision of adequate and cost effective public health and social services to populations in need.

Policy 8.08.01 Work health and social service agencies to establish and maintain cost effective public services to the populations in need.

Policy 8.08.02 Support efforts to develop healthier communities and development patterns.

Policy 8.08.03 Support efforts to integrate social and health service needs into community design and workforce development.

## CHILD CARE SERVICES

Goal 8.09 Provision of adequate and accessible child care facilities to promote family and child development for working families.

Policy 8.09.01 Establish standards for providing child care facilities in new developments and impact fees to support capital needs of such public facilities.

Policy 8.09.02 Encourage community design and development patterns that integrate child care facilities into new development, businesses, and the facilities of larger employers.

## SERVICES

Goal 8.10 Provision of adequate, energy efficient, and cost-effective public services. (CDG-17) [Work with the other elements of the Glenn County General Plan to guide the placement of County services so that they are provided most efficiently and economically. (EEG-2) Adequate community services, facilities, and infrastructure. (DPS-4 Goal)]

Policy 8.10.01 Establish level of service standards for public services ~~which~~ that can be used to evaluate the impact of development on the various services, and to evaluate service distribution and expansion needs. (CDP-111)

Policy 8.10.02 Require new development within ~~urban limit lines~~ community growth boundaries to connect to sewer and water services when available, and discourage installation of septic tanks in urban areas. When sewer and water services are not immediately available, commitments to serve in the future shall be obtained from service providers prior to development approval. (CDP-113)

Policy 8.10.03 Discourage the extension of public facilities ~~which~~ that would generate growth in areas inconsistent with the policies of this General Plan. (CDP-115)

Policy 8.10.04 Site future fire and police stations to enable minimum acceptable response times to service calls. (CDP-130)
